

Corrugated Metal Roofing

1. Cut the corrugated metal into appropriate size panels.
2. Use Radio Shack etchant. (optional - adds texture)
3. Spray both sides with dull-coat and let dry. (Optional - may helps with adhesion)
4. Spray both sides with a flat grey primer and let dry. (Floquil, Krylon, Rustoleum, etc.)
5. Spray one side with a cover coat of flat black paint. This will be the top side of the roof panel.
6. Spray the other side with a very light coat of flat black allowing the grey to show through in a random manner. This is the underside.
7. On the top side lightly brush Polly Light Grey (or substitute a craft paint) on top of the black allowing the black to show through. Work with the corrugations and thin with rubbing alcohol if necessary.
8. Use stiff flat brush and dab/stipple a Dark Rust Color over the rusty area usually heavier along the bottom and one side. (I use 30% Floquil roof brown and 70% Floquil rust to get a reddish brown color)
9. Use the same brush and dab/stipple burnt umber craft paint covering about half of the rust color. Don't cover over the rust color just apply the burnt umber so it blends and darkens the rust color.
10. Seal both sides with dull-coat.
