The meet will be co-sponsored by the Prairie Rail Workshop and the Saskatchewan Railroad Historical Association. A convention hotel is still being arranged but the majority of the activities will take place at the Saskatchewan Railway Museum. For those interested in contests they will have the following categories: Locomotives, Rolling Stock, Structures, and Dioramas. If there are enough entries in a given category they will split into sub categories (i.e. Steam and Diesel Locomotives). It was reported in the last Highball! that Camrose was willing to host the 2016 Spring Meet, having originally offered to put on the 2015 meet. A formal bid will be presented at the 6<sup>th</sup> Division AGM in Saskatoon.

# **Area Reports**

# **Calgary** – Rob Badmington

In April, another successful SUPERTRAIN show was staged. Despite some extremely challenging circumstances thrown at us by construction at the Soccer Centre, we were pleased to welcome 12,200 guests to our largest show yet. We had displays filling all four indoor soccer fields as well as the complete length of the upper mezzanine. Iron Horse Park from Airdrie took over 3500 people for rides on the other side of the concourse and we collected over \$4700 and 1220 pounds of food for the Calgary Food Bank. Layouts from Vancouver, Chilliwack, and Trail joined the regulars from Calgary, Edmonton, Lethbridge, and Moose Jaw. Several manufacturers came to the show for the first time to display their products to Canadian modellers.

We are very excited to announce that SUPERTRAIN is moving to a bright new facility

for 2015. We have signed an agreement to hold the show at the Genesis Centre in Northeast Calgary next April 18 & 19. The facility takes care of many of the shortcomings that we have had to deal with at the Soccer Centre in recent years. The display space available is much larger, over 70,000 square feet on one level, with four truck loading doors, elevators to the upper mezzanine viewing level, a state of the art sound system for audible announcements, and plenty of paved parking. The Genesis Centre is a five minute walk from the Saddletowne C-Train station, so for the first time in 7 years, we will have excellent public transportation to the show. The Genesis Centre is also right in the middle of a populous community, so we hope that we will be able to introduce Model Railroading to a whole new group of people who may not have come to SUPERTRAIN before. Please be sure to let everyone know about the new location, and

mark your calendars for the third weekend in April for Canada's biggest model train show.

It wasn't exactly model railroading, but a number of Calgary modellers were seen at Champion Park back in June, extending the track by over 60 feet southward. Even 85 pound rail is pretty heavy when you are lifting it without machines and spiking it down like they did a hundred years ago. The new track extension is required to make space for CPR Mail Express car No.3622 which has now arrived at the park. The car has made the rounds of Alberta museums over several decades after retirement, having been at the Alberta Railway Museum in Edmonton, and the High River Museum until it went back to CP at Ogden last year. In case you don't know, Champion Park is a privately owned property adjacent to Highway 2 near Okotoks that is home to a nice collection of rolling stock, signals, and railway buildings including namesake Champion station.

South Bank Short Lines Boomer Auction in October was again well attended by sellers and buyers alike. Modellers from Calgary area, Edmonton, Lethbridge, and Medicine Hat filled the hall to bid on some great merchandise.

#### Calgary Model Trainmen - Dale Sproule

CMT hosted our twice a year Public Open House on Saturday, November 15, 2014. Before we open our doors for each Open House, we advertise our event and place several banners outside the clubhouse hoping to perhaps attract folks driving by. We feel it important for members to also display some of our projects we are working on at home too and this creates added interest. Our traditional hours are 10 am to 4 pm and right at 10 this year CMT members dressed with club shirts (with a tight crease) met the first of 60+ visitors for the day consisting of singles right up to families with mini-Engineers. We invite visitors to have a coffee and donut, purchase a fund-raising 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Car (50' Boxcar or Hopper - we can ship out as many of these Accurail kits as you

want, contact CMT), or maybe a club mug and try some operation using our wireless Digitrax. Some visitors have learned from previous Open Houses that they can bring their own motive power for operation on the layout. We try to explain the operation of the club, some scenery techniques and always issue an invitation to become a club member. We always have membership forms ready to be filled out. Many returning visitors remark that they see positive changes at the club. The last visitor left at right at 4 pm so it was quite a full day for members.

Our next and last open house in our present location (612-12 Avenue S.E.) will be Saturday, April 25, one week following SUPERTRAIN., Hours will be 10 am – 4 pm and again we will have coffee and donuts, club cars and mugs for sale. There is free street parking so please plan to attend.

Unfortunately we are losing our home at the end of August, 2015. CMT does not fit into the expansion plans of the Calgary Stampede who have been excellent landlords over the years. #### Edmonton - Mark Johnson

In September, MMRF held the annual Greater Edmonton model Train Show (GETS) at Millennium Place in Sherwood Park for the second year. This is a bright and airy place, with better parking than the previous location, and the attendance increased over last year as people become familiar with the new site. Many bargains were to be had from the vendors (ask me how I know), and there were great displays as well.

The MMRF held its first fall Swap Meet in November, and, despite the first heavy snowfall of the year, a great turnout of buyers and sellers made it through the drifts to make the event a success.

The EMRA has been hosting quarterly open operating sessions on its Monashee Pacific layout in Fort Edmonton Park, providing interested modellers with a chance to run under TT&TO (TimeTable and Train Order) operation. The club also hosted a full-day operating session during Northern Rails 2014, a biennial invitational operating weekend. Attendees appreciated the chance to learn about the layout and have extra time to apply the knowledge to the operations. Over 20 people were entertained for the full day.

The Northern Rails event attracted a few new layouts this year, and it appears that even more local layout owners are considering introducing some level of formal operations on their own layouts.

Some of the mall-based clubs have reestablished themselves in the Fort Mall in Fort Saskatchewan, so there are trains running there most weekends. Camrose is hosting a Swap Meet and Train Show this December, so model railroad activity is spreading out around Edmonton in all directions.

# Lethbridge - Tony Lee

The Southern Alberta Model Railway Club is in for another busy modeling season. Our group has been asked to go to the local hobby show in Lethbridge in January and we have also been invited to Supertrain in April 2015.

Several clinics are underway this winter at the club including scenery, scratch building, switches and decoder installation. Work is progressing on scenery upgrades, and a card operating system is to be installed for the HO layout this winter/spring. We continue to attract new members with three new persons joining the club this fall. Progress is being made on the possibility of an expansion of our facilities in Gyro Park. We need to raise some additional funds after which we hope to be able to apply for a Community Capital Project Grant from the City of Lethbridge in the spring of 2015. If successful, work on a proposed addition would not start until 2016.

This fascinating piece of trackwork existed in a back alley between 106 and 107 Streets in Edmonton, just south of 104 Avenue. The centre track was an industrial lead which curved out of CN's City Yard and stretched a couple of blocks south to serve various warehouses. This three way turnout is a stub switch, so the switch points moved laterally to line up with the selected track and pivoted from a spot near where the photographer stood. The switch stand had three notches to set the handle into, rather than the usual two. All CN and CP track in downtown Edmonton is now long gone.
